Brief Overview: Cape Town is a city of beauty and history, but it is also a city of contrasts. The beauty of majestic **Table Mountain** and the immediate **Victoria and Alfred Waterfront** is evident as soon as the ship pulls into the harbor, showcasing South Africa's unique landscape. However, if one looks beyond Table Mountain and the immediate Victoria and Alfred Waterfront, the real beauty is its people and the stories they tell through their experiences, during, as well as after, Apartheid. The nearby **townships** may look grim in comparison to the pristine waterfront area, but the beauty and resilience of the townships and its peoples are clear. Even with political struggles and financial adversity, the threads of family, culture, and community are apparent, and each township tells its own powerful story.



South Africa is also known for its **wildlife**. Such familiar wonders as the elephant, rhinoceros, hippopotamus, and giraffe are joined by antelopes, monkeys, and aardvarks. Colorful birds, unique reptiles, and fascinating insects round out the experience. As amazing as the variety is the spectacle of numbers, for the African plains are the last place on Earth where vast herds still roam in primeval abundance. Safaris and game drives organized by Semester at Sea provide an opportunity to venture through a variety of wildlife reserves and

national parks to see these animals in their natural habitat.

2 TOWNSHIP HOMESTAY – GROUP A

Townships in South Africa came about as a result of apartheid city-planning policies, which excluded 'non-white' people from living in the suburbs of the city. They were forcibly moved to peripheral areas on the edge of the city, where they had to live in harsh conditions and cope with extreme poverty. Although



apartheid officially ended in 1994, many people still face harsh conditions from the consequences of poverty. Despite struggling, the townships are filled with a strong sense of community, vibrancy, and faith. There is a growing hope as many redefine their futures within and beyond the boundaries of the township.

Tambo Village is a small, contained community, located within the Gugulethu Township where everyone knows each other and lives within walking distance,

making it an ideal homestay location. This homestay project is owned and operated by community members who have a vested interest in the comfort and safety of their guests.

Tambo houses are built out of brick and mortar and have running water, flush toilets, and electricity. Accommodations are simple and geysers (water heaters) are not standard; bathing in some houses is either with cold water or with water heated up on the stove. Participants will share a room with another SAS participant. Meals, linen and bedding are provided by the host family. The food quality is excellent and special dietary needs may be catered to upon request.

Note: At the village's request, this trip is not suitable for children under 12 years of age.

The journey from the base to the summit takes just under four minutes and one can enjoy spectacular views, as the floor of the car rotates 360 degrees during the ascent. Your coach will meet you at the top and complete your city orientation on the return to the ship.

After filming the movie "Safe House" in Cape Town, Denzil Washington had this to say about Langa: "The warmest and most welcoming place I have ever filmed."

Langa is a suburb in Cape Town that was established in 1927, as a result of the 1923 Urban Areas Act. It is one of the many areas in South Africa, that were designated for Black Africans before the apartheid era. It is the oldest of such suburbs in Cape Town and was the location of much resistance to apartheid.

Walk through the streets, homes, and hearts of this suburb. During the course of the afternoon, we want to show you "a day in the life of a Langa township resident". Learn about entrepreneurial activity and social customs; and how women have made use of traditional Xhosa customs to create a living for themselves in the city.

We will visit people's homes of shacks, side by side with upper class "Beverley Hills" homes, and describe how the rich and poor live adjacent to one another here in peace and harmony.

We end our tour of Langa with a visit to the Happy Feet Project, an initiative started in 2007, to provide township kids with positive influences to keep them away from gangs and drugs in the community. After an inspiring performance of gumboot dancing, and an uplifting afternoon's exposure to the "Spirit of Langa", we will return to the quayside.

For obvious reasons this group tour takes place on Sundays. We will depart from the guayside and after 30 minutes we will be in the township of Langa passing District Six en-route from which more than 50,000 so-called "coloured" South Africans were forcibly removed from their homes during the apartheid-era.

Sunday is probably the best day to be in the townships. Residents are home from work, and like the fashion-conscious Italians parading around their piazzas, so to do the residents of Langa, dressed in their finest and swishing around their streets. From early in the morning, groups of young and old make their way to the church of their choice, testimony to the fact that 76% of South Africans call themselves Christians.

We will join a community church for a part of their service, enjoying the soulful singing and rhythmic dancing which is so much a part of African tradition. Thereafter, in the company of your guide and local residents, we will walk to the

home of a local community leader to enjoy a cup of tea and a discussion about the values, traditions, beliefs, language, and rituals of the Xhosa-speaking South Africans.

Your tour ends with a drive through Langa and adjacent Bonteheuwel which is today home to many of the previous residents of District Six and their descendants. We have the opportunity to contrast the stark cultural differences between these two communities, separated by a roadway, divided by apartheid 40 years ago, and today arguably still miles apart.

CAP 134-201 Whale Watching

Your early-morning transfer from the pier will take approximately 2.5-hours in order to reach your destination.

Anticipation mounting, arrive at the boat launch and begin your whale watching expedition. You will be fitted with a comfortable life jacket and receive an informative briefing about what to look for and expect during this memorable experience.

We start our trip from the Kleinbaai Harbour (east of Danger Point). From there, we move towards the Pearly Beach area where we find our highest concentration of Southern right whales (Jul to mid-Dec). The Southern right whales come to our calm bays every year from July to December to either, calve and nurse their young or to mate. After spending the allowed time with these magnificent creatures we move towards Dyer Island where we view the African penguins as well as various other seabirds. Behind Dyer Island we visit Geyser Rock, which is

residence to about 60,000 Cape fur seals. Between these two islands we find ourselves in Shark Alley. Shark Alley is world famous for its Great White sharks, which makes this probably the only trip in the world where you have a chance of seeing a Southern right whale as well as an 80 % chance of seeing a Great White shark. After this exhilarating two and a half hour trip we return to the Kleinbaai harbour to enjoy some refreshments at The Great White House.

Continue your tour to the quaint and seaside town of Hermanus for a light lunch at a local restaurant. Thereafter bid Hermanus farewell and return to Cape Town following a scenic route.

Amy Biehl was a young American Fulbright Scholar who was stoned to death in 1993 in South Africa, where she had gone to help disenfranchised voters in the struggle against apartheid. Her parents, Peter (now deceased) and Linda, and their family, established the Amy Biehl Foundation Trust to continue Amy's work and have been highly

supportive of groups concerned with the lasting effects of apartheid. In the townships, you will see the lasting impact of apartheid and the continuing racial discrimination of poverty today. As you meet the townspeople, remember that there are social forces at work that have caused these terrible conditions to occur. *This highly interactive trip is a favorite with SAS participants*; many revisit the Foundation during their remaining time in Cape Town because it is such a rewarding experience. On this trip, spend the day touring the various facilities and programs in the townships run by the Amy Biehl Foundation including the Amy Biehl Music Program, which teaches sixth and seventh graders music theory and

practice; the Youth Reading Role Models program, where seventh graders read to first graders; the Buthisizwe Training Centre, a facility which provides instruction on block making, sewing, and aluminum window-frame making; and the Khayelitsha Golf Club—*A Driving Range for the People.* The Foundation provides the youth with the opportunity for constructive and safe activities after school and makes the game of golf accessible to all South Africans regardless of race or economic circumstance. Lunch is included at a township restaurant featuring traditional Xhosa foods.

The sustainability and unique nature of Baphumelele as a community-based project is assured through its deep roots in the community. The Home in particular is viewed by many as a sentinel of hope in the townships of the Western Cape and a demonstration of what a community can achieve when everyone works together.

At the orphanage, if she is available, you will be met by the founding member of the establishment, Rosie Mashale, who will offer a brief tour of the orphanage coupled with an explanation as to what it aims to achieve. Once you are familiar with the establishment, the group will be split up to assist with various activities taking place throughout the orphanage, including infant minding, playing with toddlers, reading to the children, general handiwork, and meal preparation in the kitchen.

After completing the various tasks assigned, bid farewell to the children at the orphanage and transfer to Langa for a cycling tour and a visit to the Happy Feet Project where you will meet the founder, Siviwe Mbinda and enjoy a performance by the kids. Happy Feet Youth Project is a NPO founded in 2007 by Siviwe Mbinda in an effort to provide a safe after-school environment for the children of his community. The program includes approximately 70 boys and girls ages 3-20.

PLEASE NOTE: Restroom facilities are extremely limited in the Township; please use facilities prior to departure.

Most of the sites visited on this tour are part of an African Township, which whilst having extreme poverty, is busy being uplifted by the government and the local community, making it a place of hope. One needs to be prepared for this aspect of the tour, as it is definitely a "no frills "experience.

Through participating in this tour, you will receive an insight into the local African culture like no other you have ever experienced, and in doing so, will contribute to the economic uplifting so vital for the people of South Africa.

Day 4: Tuesday, October 29

CAP 136-401 CAPE TOWN, APARTHEID, & ROBBEN ISLAND

This trip provides historical insight into the social injustices of Cape Town's past. Begin the day's journey with a stop at the Bo-Kaap Museum, a typical example of a Malay Quarter residence. Experience the unique culture, lifestyle, and personality of this Cape Muslim community and their role in Cape Town's



development. Then, visit the District Six Museum and learn how 60,000 families were forcibly removed from the once vibrant suburb. Next, a visit to the townships and Cape Flats shows how sprawling satellite camps of seemingly endless shanties provide little more than a roof and some shelter. This journey through history continues with a visit

to Langa, the oldest existing township on the Western Cape. Local community workers host you in this vibrant community as numerous squatters set about building their own brick homes, with the help of state grants. Then sample traditional African sorghum beer at a local tavern, or shebeen, before enjoying a lunch of traditional South African dishes. Afterward, continue to Robben Island by ferry. This former leper colony was a political prison during apartheid. View

Nelson Mandela's prison cell while ex-political prisoners give a detailed commentary. Also, visit the quarry, where the former president's eyes were damaged, and where individuals in the struggle endured backbreaking labor. Now operating as a living museum, Robben Island also hosts about 23 mammals and 132 bird species including the African penguin. Return to the ship after this thought-provoking day.

Please note: Wear comfortable, lightweight clothing and comfortable walking shoes. Bring sunblock, sun hat, sunglasses, and windbreaker.

CAP 109-401 KHAYALITSHA TOWNSHIP

Visit Khayelitsha, South Africa's fastest growing township. The impression from the outside is fairly grim—many shacks line the outskirts and give no indication of the vibrant culture found within. However, life in Khayelitsha is filled with entrepreneurial energy and community spirit; this trip is your opportunity to gain a first-hand look. Upon entering the township, visit the



Khayelitsha Craft Market. Continue to the Philani Nutrition Centre, where you will view weavings and silkscreen paintings, a project undertaken by the women in the community. Visit *Medicines sans Frontiers* (Doctors Without Borders), which provides an HIV clinic to the community. Finally, a visit to Vicky's Bed and Breakfast is followed by a visit to the Waterfront *shebeen* (tavern) before returning to the ship.

Please note: There are limited restrooms in the township. Only local currency is accepted in the craft market.

Bring out your head torch or flashlight. Sadly, it's time to

head back down the hillside. Treading carefully in the light of your torch, we slowly make our way down Lion's Head, where the driver & coach will be waiting to transfer you back to the quayside.

Please note: Participants are advised to take along a daypack with suitable clothes for either cold or wet weather; robust hiking shoes; a head torch or flashlight; and at least 1 liter of drinking water.

They were forcibly moved to peripheral areas on the edge of the city, where they had to live in harsh conditions and cope with extreme poverty. Although apartheid



officially ended in 1994, many people still face harsh conditions from the consequences of poverty. Despite struggling, the townships are filled with a strong sense of community, vibrancy and faith. There is a growing hope as many redefine their futures within and beyond the boundaries of the township.

Township homestay in Tambo Village

Tambo Village is a small, contained community located within the Gugulethu Township where everyone knows each other and lives within walking distance,

making it an ideal homestay location. This homestay project is fully-embraced by the community; it is owned and operated by community members who have a vested interest in the comfort and safety of their guests.

Tambo houses are built out of brick and mortar and have running water, flush toilets and electricity. Accommodations are simple and geysers (water heaters) are not standard; bathing in some houses is either with cold water or with water heated up on the stove. Participants will share a room with another SAS participant within the meals, linen and bedding are provided by the host family. The food quality is excellent and special dietary needs may be catered to upon request.

Note: At the village's request, this trip is not suitable for children under 12 years of age.

CAP 115-501 CAPE POINT & PENGUINS

Full day



Contrary to popular belief, Cape Point is not the southernmost tip of Africa. That honor belongs to Cape Agulhas. It is, however, the meeting place of the Atlantic Ocean and False Bay. The route to Cape Point takes you along the M3, via the scenic Ou Kaapse Weg (Old Cape Road), Sun Valley, Misty Cliffs, and Scarborough. The Cape of Good Hope Nature Reserve occupies 19,151 acres of indigenous flora and fauna. Walk to the platform on top of the hill for a great view of the peninsula

and the place where the Atlantic and Indian Oceans are said to meet. If you prefer, take the optional funicular railway at your own expense, which will transport you to the platform. From that location, there are approximately 120 steps to the old lighthouse on top of Cape Point. There is free time to explore the area on your own. Then, depart the reserve and continue along the shoreline of the Indian Ocean, through the historic naval base of Simon's Town. Stop at Boulder's Beach, one of only two mainland Jackass Penguin breeding colonies in the world. Lunch is enjoyed at a scenically located restaurant. On completion of lunch, return to the quayside joining the M3 motorway and passing the University of Cape Town, Rhodes Memorial, Mostert's Mill, and the famous Groote Schuur Hospital en-route

After a brief visit at the Huguenot Monument, continue to a local winery for a wine tasting and a picnic lunch in the pristine surroundings before returning to Cape Town.

Please note: 21-gear mountain bikes and safety helmets are used. The biking can be considered strenuous at times and may not be suitable for those with limited mobility/endurance. CAP 120-501 TABLE MOUNTAIN HIKE

Tackle the front face of Table Mountain head-on, powering your way up the clefted Platteklip Gorge, towering above Cape Town, and the source of the lifegiving water which sustained the 16th century Dutch settlers of the Cape. While the hike and views are exhilarating, the most fulfilling aspect of this hike is the narrative and interpretive discussion you will get from two tour guides; a geologytrained hiker and a qualified mountain guide. Our discussion will include the history of the settlement and the importance of water, geology, flora and flora, and any other topics of general interest. After approximately two hours of hiking, you will have climbed almost 600 meters to reach the summit of one of the World's Seven Natural Wonders. Take a bow and pat yourself on the back. But, the journey has only started. We turn eastwards and walk along the front table towards Maclear's Beacon, the highest point on the Table Mountain Range and the anchor of southern Africa's trignometrical network. Enjoy your snacks and a well-earned rest at Maclear's Beacon before we turn and head towards the Upper Cableway Station. Here one can make use of the facilities and coffee shop, or buy a memento before taking the cable-car down to the Lower Cableway Station. Your coach & driver will be waiting to transfer you back to the quayside.

Please note: This hike will be steep and strenuous - a moderate to high level of fitness is required. Please bring a daypack, some snacks and at least two liters of water. Always carry warm clothes in your daypack as the summit can be cold, wet, and windy! This is not a walk in the park; you will need good hiking shoes. This tour is weather permitting. Each participant is responsible for purchasing their own cable car ticket down the mountain (approximately R100). Please note that the cableway closes if the winds are too strong.

On this tour you will be in the company of township residents for the entire day. You will get to understand why, in spite of the spectacular natural scenic beauty of the Cape, so many visitors to Cape Town regard their visit to the townships and meeting these local Africans, as their most memorable experience in our country.

You will become part of the community by walking the streets, buying the ingredients for lunch from Fruit & Vegetable Spaza stores in the community. You will see Xhosa ladies making traditional beer called Umgqobothi, and the local delicacy called "Smileys" (sheep's heads). After purchasing all your ingredients locally (contributing to the local township economy and absorbing local culture), you will go to the home of your host where you will peel, slice, and chat; season, sauté, and chat; sip, savor, and chat ... cooking up a storm.

Once you have enjoyed the fruits of your labor and the company of your host, you will bid him/her farewell with a nutritious gift in tow, heading for the Happy Feet Gumboot Dancers. This social project utilizes local culture in the form of dance to get children away from the lure of gangs and drugs and into a project with positive influences and role models. After enjoying their energetic performance, you will leave your nutritious gift, the balance of your lunchtime meal with them, and then head back to the quayside.

Please note: This township is extremely impoverished and as such this tour is a "no frills" experience. Your participation contributes to the economic uplift vital to this small community.
