The waterfront city was once a center for seafaring trade and today is filled with colorful wooden buildings that house many boutiques and restaurants with traditional Norwegian cuisine. Outdoor adventure awaits those who pass through Bergen, offering trails, waterfalls, and hikes through neighborhoods that rest in the hills of the city. Journey through Bergen's oldest quarter that runs parallel to the



eastern shore of Vägen Harbor. Within the quarter you can visit the lively Torget Fish Market and find smoked whale meat, fish and chips, occasionally some reindeer and elk, and everything in between. From the Fish Market, hop on the Fløibanen funicular for a short ride up the Fløyen Mountain. From the top of Fløyen you will not only enjoy spectacular views of the entire city of Bergen, but can also explore the various hiking trails or even take out a canoe on Skomakerdiket Lake. Get a taste of Norwegian art with a special guided tour through the Bryggen Kunst Museum, home to a wonderful collection of 18th and 19th century Norwegian and international artists.

Bergen has given a warm welcome to its visitors for more than 900 years. Bryggen has become a symbol of Norway's cultural heritage and has gained a place on UNESCO's World Heritage List. The old Hanseatic wharf is architecturally unique and is perhaps one of

Breakfast at hotel. Depart Stalheim for Gudvangen by coach. Enjoy a two hour Sognefjord cruise to see spectacular Nærøyfjord and Aurlandsfjord. The Nærøyfjord, a branch of the Sognefjord, has been included in UNESCO's World Heritage List and is considered to be among the most scenic fjord areas on the planet. After the cruise, meet with your coach again at Flåm and drive further to cross Sognefjord, Fodnes-Manheller, and Solvorn-Ornes by car ferry.



Next, visit Urnes Stave Church. The stave churches are Norway's unique contribution to the world's cultural heritage. Most were built between approx. 1130 and 1350. Though similar churches existed elsewhere in Europe, only the Norwegian ones have survived. Of the original approx. 1,000 churches, 28 remain. Urnes Stave Church is the eldest and most decorated of them. In 1979 it was included on UNESCO's World Heritage List. After the visit, proceed to Bøyum Glacier, an arm of Jostedal Glacier and enjoy some free time

to admire the landscape. Continue the tour to the village of Loen, along Nordfjord. Spend dinner and an overnight at Hotel Loenfjord.

18th July (Fri):



After breakfast, depart Loen for Hellesylt. Enjoy an hour cruise on Geirangerfjord listed on UNESCO's Nature Heritage List. Geiranger is the jewel in the crown of the Norwegian fjords. It is a fairytale landscape with its majestic, snow-covered

mountaintops, and wild and beautiful waterfalls. Upon arrival in Geiranger, drive along the national tourist route of Geiranger and Trollstigen. This promises to be an exceptional driving

experience along a route steeped in tradition, through spectacular scenery of deep fjords and lush valleys - wild, wonderful and vibrant. Enjoy spectacular Eagle Road, followed by a short ferry crossing at Eidsdal-Linge to join the historic Trollstigen road, with its 11 hairpin



bends. Take some time on top of the Trollstigen area where you will see the blend of magnificient nature, design, and architecture at some of the view platforms. After some free time, proceed to the town of Røros, listed in UNESCO's World Culture Heritage List. Today, the small town of Røros is a living museum, and the entire town centre with its authentic wooden buildings is protected. As you explore Røros' narrow streets, old courtyards, and

buildings, you will find an amazing number of charming shops and interesting workshops. The town is famous for its high concentration of artists and craftsmen, and it also boasts an impressive list of award-winning designer products from Røros based companies. 

At the top of Mount Fløien, walk towards Lake Skomakerdiket. Enjoy your visit, as the views get more and more spectacular! After approximately 45 minutes, reach Rundemannsvegen and continue up to the highest point at 570 meters. In the Fløien area, you will be walk over dirt roads and paths and back to the Fløibanen to take the funicular down to the center of Bergen and back to the ship.

Please Note: Good walking shoes are recommended. Also, bring a windproof jacket and a bottle of water.



Bergen was founded in the year 1066 and until the 1830s, was the largest city in the country and a center for commerce and shipping. For several centuries, the Hanseatic Merchants had one of their four major overseas trading offices in Bergen. Our guided walking tour starts along the

German pier, Bryggen. View the characteristic wooden buildings and alleyways with pointed gables facing the harbor. The promenade gives an intimate picture of what it was like to live in the town in the Middle Ages.

The Hanseatic Museum **is** situated in one of the old trade houses at Bryggen. The Hanseatic League had one of their foreign Offices at Bryggen in Bergen from approx. 1360 until 1754. The Hanseatic merchants traded mainly with stock fish and grain from northern Norway.

Your next stop is the Bryggen Museum, which is based on the findings of the archeological excavations of Bryggen from the 12th century illustrating daily life during the Middle Ages. Today Bryggen is a fascinating honeycomb of active workshops, where painters, weavers, and craftsmen produce fine-quality and original items. Our walking tour ends at the famous Fish and Flower Market.
